Iowa State University's impact in Johnson County

505 Johnson County residents are enrolled at ISU including:

- 150 students in the College of Engineering
- 108 students in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences
- 70 students in the College of Agriculture and Life Science
- 64 students in the College of Human Sciences
- 45 students in the College of Business
- 37 students in the Graduate College
- 26 students in the College of Design
- 5 students in the College of Veterinary Medicine
- 147 Johnson County students were on ISU's 2017 Spring Honor Roll

2,607 ISU Alumni reside in Johnson County including:

- 184 Engineers
- 76 in Agriculture
- 69 Pre K/K-12 Educators
- 50 Architects
- 35 in Banking/Finance
- 26 Veterinarians

7,821 Johnson County residents directly benefited from ISU Extension and Outreach education – covering the entire lifespan, from our youngest to oldest Iowans. We're focused on feeding people, keeping them healthy, empowering communities, and turning the world over to the next generation better than we found it. That's how we're building a strong Iowa.

Iowa State University's science-focused business assistance program is a key problem solver for Johnson County businesses. The Center for Industrial Research and Service (CIRAS) provided engineering services to 52 businesses last year including:

The Small Business Development Center (SBDC) serving Johnson County assisted 255 clients last year, helping to create or retain 86 jobs and start 19 new businesses.
